About the Composer


Theodore F. Morse (April 13, 1873 - May 25, 1924)

Born in Washington D.C., Morse, an American composer of popular songs, was educated at the Maryland Military & Naval Academy. He went on to study both violin and piano. He and his wife, Theodora Morse, became a successful songwriting team for Tin Pan Alley. Listed as Terriss & Morse, they were one of the earliest Tin Pan Alley husband-wife songwriting teams.

About the Editor

John Bentley b. 1934



John Bentley pursued a successful career in banking and auditing and is highly regarded by his colleagues. Music is an avocation. Following in the steps of some of our fine self-taught composers of the past, John taught himself to enter music into Sibelius in order to tidy up some old hand written scores for the City of Perth Brass Band for which he has been librarian for a quarter century. Thus a new talent was discovered. John's attention to detail manifests itself in the quality of his score and parts.

About the Music

This 1902 publication by Carl Fischer was composed by Theodore F. Morse. The piece is classified as a "Characteristic" and may have been intended to describe a legend. There are clearly frog sounds in the percussion and frog motifs in the winds. Mostly they are presented separately from lizard motifs. At measure 71, the two ideas (frog and lizard) are combined for the first time.

Despite the unlikely title, this imaginative vintage piece is fun to perform and worth exploring.

Bullfrog Sound Effect (called for in the percussion section.)

Google "Frog Rasp" for an inexpensive wooden instrument to create the sound of a frog.

Or - Create Your Own

Drill a small hole in the bottom of an empty coffee can. Approximate center would be a good placement. Thread a very course, strong string through the hole. Make a big knot to keep the string from pulling through. Apply rosin to the string. Grab the string firmly between thumb and finger and slide away from the can. Voila-- instant bullfrog! Note that the bottom of the can has to vibrate. Experiment to achieve just the right sound.
